Happy New Year to all residents of our beautiful community! The New Year will be bringing many new and exciting additions to Santa Clara. Harmons will anchor a vibrant new commercial center at the intersection of Rachel Drive and Pioneer Parkway. Gubler Park will see the addition of new Pickleball courts and other amenities. Restrooms at Canyon View Park will be renovated. Highway 91 at the hill leading to Ivins will be widened and improved. A Veterans Memorial is being designed and will be installed at the Cemetery. A new City Councilman, Jarett Waite, is taking office, and we are bidding farewell to David Whitehead, who has served one four year term.

As these major events were unfolding in 2015, the Mayor and Council agreed that we should give residents an opportunity to visit with elected representatives and senior staff regarding how these activities will unfold, and to provide input and suggestions as we begin crafting the budget for the fiscal year that begins on July 1, 2016.

You can accomplish that New Year's Resolution to become more involved in your community by participating in an open house scheduled for Wednesday, January 6, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. at the Rachel Drive Fire Station. Representatives from Harmons will be available to discuss plans for what will be developed around their anchor store. City Parks and Recreation staff will be on hand to describe recreation improvements in the works. Public Works staff will be available to describe the Highway 91 project and other improvements.

Most importantly, the Mayor and City Council will be available to address your concerns and visit about future priorities. In the past few weeks, residents have expressed concerns about approval of a limited service restaurant liquor license issued for the Granary, the installation of a four-way stop sign at Lava Flow and Arrowhead, closing Lava Cove during the installation of subdivision improvements, and evidence that water is surfacing along the base of the hill behind the Jacob Hamblin home. A common theme expressed by concerned citizens is the desire for more transparency and information prior to decisions being made.

In many cases, established ordinances and standards guide the decision making process and the opportunities for public input and comment. Please come and learn about these processes, as well as taking the opportunity to discuss your concerns with your elected officials.

We will be providing the ability to leave written comments and suggestions, as well as letting us know your top priorities for the investment of community funds as we begin crafting the budget for the budget year beginning on July 1, 2016.

Come and join us – bring those Scouts working on Citizenship in the Community and other merit badges. Get introduced to the new City Councilman. Let the Mayor and Council know about any concerns you have been discussing with friends and neighbors. We hope to see many of you on Wednesday, January 6, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. in the Rachel Drive Fire Station.

## 2016 BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWALS

Santa Clara City business license renewals are now due and payable. Renewals must be paid by January 31, 2016 to avoid the \$25 late fee. As you renew your business license please make sure you provide your Utah Dept. of Commerce Registration, current EIN #, Sales Tax ID #, and any specific state license your business requires such as those for contractors, salons, child care, massage therapy, pest control, or other state licensed occupations. Daycares and preschools must be current on Fire Safety Inspections which can be scheduled by calling 619-3927. Making sure the above information is included and up to date will help expedite your business license renewal. For business license questions call 673-6712 X 201.

**JANUARY 2016 PARKS DEPT. UPDATES**

The Archie Gubler Park expansion is underway behind Lava Ridge Intermediate School. The pickle ball court concrete has been poured and the fences installed. The volleyball court and pavilion are under construction.

Please remember to turn off you lawn irrigation systems during January. Lawns need very little moisture during the dormant season of winter. By shutting off your irrigation clocks, you will save money in your utility bill and keep sidewalks from becoming dangerously iced over. If you do decide to run a cycle of water on your lawn, irrigate only when temperatures are above freezing and remember to turn off the clock when completed. Let's be water wise and hope for rain.

**Volunteer Projects:** Special thanks to Christian Case for completing his Eagle Project by repairing and improving the Jacob Hamblin Trail from the Cemetery to Fort Clare, especially at the retention pond dam crossing where the trail had been damaged by rains.

Kyle Rogers completed his Eagle project by realigning the Jacob Hamblin Trail near the Cemetery hillside. The steep grade required several switchbacks and several new water diversions. The old segment of the trail will be partially removed due to Highway 91 construction so the new trail will ensure that the trail stays open.

**2016 CEMETERY CLEAN UP DATES**

There are three regularly scheduled cemetery clean ups annually. They begin on the first Monday of February, May and November.

The first cemetery clean up is scheduled to begin Monday February 1, 2016. All flowers and decorations should be removed from the cemetery before Feb. 1, 2016. Remaining flowers and decorations will be removed and disposed of by city personnel with the exception of fresh burials. Flowers and decorations may be returned to the cemetery Friday Feb. 5th.

The next two annual cemetery clean ups will begin on Monday May 2 and on Monday November 7, 2016. We appreciate your help as we strive to keep the cemetery a clean and beautiful place of remembrance.

**ANNUAL DOG LICENSE & VACCINATION CLINIC**

Santa Clara City will hold its annual dog license/vaccination clinic on January 23, 2016. The clinic will be at the Old Fire Station at 2775 Circle Drive; Hours: 8:30 am—12:00 pm.



Dog License fees are as follows:

1st dog fixed: \$10.00	Not fixed: \$20.00
2nd dog fixed: \$12.00	Not fixed: \$22.00

Vaccination fees determined by the veterinarian administering shots. The City dog tag and rabies vaccine tag are to be on a collar on your dog at all times. City ordinance requires your dogs to be licensed annually and current on their rabies vaccination. The 2016 dog tags are now available at the Town Hall Office if you would like to license your dog now.

**2016 CLEAN-UP DUMPSTER DATES:**

2016 quarterly clean up dumpsters have been scheduled as follows:

- March 11-12, 2016
- June 3-4, 2016
- September 9-10, 2016
- December 9-10, 2016

There will be 3 dumpsters at the Little League Parking Lot and 1 dumpster at the Town Hall parking Lot on the above dates.

Yellow recycling bins are also located at Canyon View & Gubler Parks and on Lava Flow Dr. just south of Santa Clara Drive. BluCan recycling also starts in Feb.

**SIDEWALK SAFETY REMINDER:** If you are still watering your lawn or other landscaped areas during the winter months please make sure sprinklers are adjusted so as not to run onto sidewalks and streets to help avoid ice forming on these surfaces and creating slipping hazards for pedestrians. Better yet, turn sprinkler systems off during these colder months and help conserve water. Thank you for your courtesy and consideration in helping to keep walk ways safe.

**H.E.A.T. PROGRAM:** The Home Energy Assistance Target Program accepts applications to assist eligible households in need of help paying their home heating bills. This federally funded program is administered by the State of Utah. Payment amounts are based on income, energy use, and at-risk groups in the household. The application period begins Nov. 1, 2015 and goes through Sept. 30, 2016, or until funds are exhausted. Each household can receive H.E.A.T. assistance once during this period. Residents who wish to apply for assistance should call 435-652-9643 to schedule an appointment. The H.E.A.T. office is located at 168 N. 100 E. Ste. 255, St. George, UT 84770.

Please remember to have an identification tag along with a Rabies tag and City license on your dogs at all times. We also encourage having identification tags on cats as well. Owners of injured or lost animals will be contacted as soon as possible by shelter staff.
