

**SANTA CLARA CITY COUNCIL WORK MEETING
WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 18, 2015
MINUTES**

THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF SANTA CLARA, WASHINGTON COUNTY, UTAH, met for a Work Meeting on Wednesday, February 18, at 5:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of the Town Hall at 2603 Santa Clara Drive, Santa Clara, Utah.

Notice of the time, place and agenda of the meeting was provided to the Spectrum and to each member of the governing body by emailing a copy of the Notice and Agenda to the Spectrum and also, along with any packet information, to the mayor and each council member, at least two days before the meeting.

3:00 PM – Mayor Rosenberg, City Council, the City Manager and Staff Department Directors drove out to the South Hills site to evaluate a potential shooting area location.

1. **Call to Order**: Mayor Rosenberg called the meeting to order at 5:04 p.m.

2. **Working Agenda**:

- Mayor Rosenberg asked the Scout in the audience to introduce himself.
- Jace Lang, Star Rank, Troop 73 – Citizenship in the Community Badge

A. General Business:

1. Introduction and Presentation regarding Road Respect; Presented by Brad Hays, Parks Director.
 - Brad Hays read and briefly described the Road Respect Alliance. It is program to encourage respect between drivers and bicyclists on Utah roads. The Southern Utah Bicyclist Association received a \$1500 grant. There are three levels that need to be met to qualify. Santa Clara has met all the requirements for the level one. To meet the requirements for level two we would like to have a get together in Santa Clara on May 28th for the Bicycle Rodeo for kids to teach them how to be safe on the road. They are giving away 75-100 bicycle helmets to children that participate. Mayor and Council Members are encouraged to participate. They would like to have the event at City Hall.
 - David asked if the event was Friday the 29th of May.
 - Brad confirmed it was Thursday, May 28th.
 - David Whitehead asked what expenses the City might incur from this.

- Brad commented the maintenance of the bike lanes and possibly purchasing the helmets. We do have part of this \$1500 grant to use.
- Herb Basso commented the costs and expenses come when we can afford it, but at least this creates a plan for the future.
- Ken Sizemore asked what the Share the Road Dialogue is.
- Brad commented the police could hand out information packets to people they pull over and cyclists.
- Ken commented he feels this community has a need for more education on bike and driver safety. He noted very few cyclists obey the rules of the road. He feels this is a great idea and hopes we include the adults as well as the children.
- Mayor commented all council members are okay with moving forward.

2. Discussion regarding the parking of a vehicle for longer than 48 consecutive hours. Ordinance 10.08.040.G.

- Ed Dickie commented a Council member wanted to look at this Ordinance and review it. Ed read the Ordinance to Mayor and Council.
- Herb Basso commented there was an incident where Alan Madsen had some family members stay with him. After only 23 hours there was a sticker on the vehicle. A neighbor had called the police because they were nervous about a new, strange vehicle parked on the street. Herb suggested maybe we change the 48 hours to 72 hours.
- David Whitehead commented a similar thing happened to him where he had company stay for a weekend without moving the vehicle.
- Herb commented if Public Safety would like the Ordinance to allow 72 hours, and if City Council is ok with the change, then it might be something we should do.
- Mayor and Council discussed having Public Safety report on the need to change the Ordinance if necessary.
- Mayor suggested to have Planning Commission look at the Ordinance and make suggestions.
- Ed commented Public Safety would enforce the Ordinance no matter what. The Ivin's Ordinance allows 72 hours but if Santa Clara's is 48, they will enforce that as well. Ed commented he would have Planning Commission review the Ordinance.
- Ken Sizemore commented the stickers the police use are really hard to get off vehicles and suggested we come up with something else.

3. **Staff Reports:**

Brad Hays

- Claude Drive to Cinder Circle Trail was staked yesterday. There are a few concerns about the width of the trail. They will be checking it tomorrow for more details.
 - Herb Basso asked how wide the trail would be.
 - Brad commented the trail would be 10 feet wide. The trail is in an easement and they are working with the property owner to not have to remove some trees.
- Eighteen of the trees along Santa Clara Drive have been accepted as Utah Heritage Trees.

- The Tree City USA Luncheon will be in Santa Clara on April 7th, 2015.
 - David Whitehead asked if there are special festivities for this event.
 - Brad commented they are thinking about having the event at Heritage Square with kids games.

Ed Dickie

- Nobody came forward to claim the holding on the Moody/Stucki home. It still needs to go to the Judge to get a clean/quiet title for Mr. Stucki. Matt Ence, the City Attorney, didn't see a problem continuing forward.

-Ken Sizemore commented DTEC met today. There is an Integrated Transportation Workshop being planned for the 13th or 16th of April. It is designed for City Council and Staff to work on the integration of bicyclists and motorists on our public roads.
