The summer heat is once again upon us and sprinkling systems dominate the early morning hours across the City. It's a good time to check your irrigation system clocks and do your part to conserve water where you can. Recently the Washington County Water Conservancy District announced the H2Oath pledge campaign and secured signatures from local county commissioners and mayors in support of the water conservation initiative. The City would like to encourage the public to participate by signing the same pledge available online at [water.utah.gov/H2Oath](http://water.utah.gov/H2Oath).

The Washington County Water Conservancy District is a not-for-profit public agency established in 1962 to manage Southern Utah's regional water needs. The district oversees the development, stabilization, management, acquisition and conservation of water resources in Washington County in an ongoing effort to provide a safe, sustainable water supply for current and future generations. The District was the first district in the state of Utah to adopt a water conservation plan; open a desert conservation garden, Red Hills Desert Garden; eliminate traditional "take or pay" municipal water contracts and regionalize its water system to encourage conservation and one of the first counties to meet Governor Gary Herbert's request to reduce water use 25 percent by 2025.

During the last two decades, the district and its municipal partners, including Santa Clara City, have invested millions of dollars annually into conservation initiatives. Efforts include, but are not limited to, converting 1,350,000 feet of open canals to pipelines, repairing leaking pipes, installing meters, developing two water conservation demonstration gardens, overseeing annual Water Fairs for more than 40,000 students, hosting more than 200 free community events and performing more than 2,000 free irrigation audits. The collective efforts of the district and its municipal partners have resulted in tremendous water use reductions. According to the Utah Division of Water Resources, residential water use in the Virgin River Basin is among the lowest in the state.


The City remains committed to water conservation efforts recognizing that further reductions, in addition to what has already been achieved, will be more difficult and expensive to accomplish. We need conservation-minded residents to help us achieve the next milestones and implement the practices outlined in the H2Oath. Conservation is a shared responsibility. Do your part and take the oath. Water is a precious resource in Utah, especially in Washington County.

Work is progressing on the Highway 91 Improvement Project scheduled to be completed in July. City crews also completed their spring road maintenance slurry seal projects around the City. The Parks Department is finishing the expansion of Gubler Park with the addition of six new pickleball courts. The City is also working with the BLM to apply for a land grant for a new recreational park in the South Hills to provide access to the very popular hiking and mountain biking trails in the area. This area has exploded with users coming from across the country to ride these amazing trails many of them located within the city limits. The City Council will be reviewing the General Plan for this area in the upcoming months to better address and accommodate these valuable resources and consider new opportunities for residents. ## JUNE CLEAN UP DUMPSTERS

If you do not have a BluCan, recycling binnies are still available at Canyon View and Gubler Parks and on Lava Flow Drive south of Santa Clara Drive. ## BACKYARD & POOL SAFETY TIPS

The building department would like to remind residents of the importance of backyard and pool safety. Make sure gates in the barrier fence around your pool are self-closing, self-latching and not accessible to small children. Other gates should be padlocked. Install a pool alarm, and an approved safety cover on pools, spas, or hot tubs. Check for warning signs of an unsafe deck and make sure repairs are made.

Barbeque grills should be away from siding, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches. Do not use grills in a garage, porch or enclosed area. Keep children away from grills when in use and never leave the grill unattended.

## WCWCD FREE WATER CHECKS

Free water system checks are available by the Washington County Water Conservancy District. The program runs between May 15—Sep 30th. The water check gives you a customized irrigation schedule, identifies your soil type, and suggests ways to efficiently water your landscape.
