SPRING BURN WINDOW

The 2016 Spring Burn Window is open through May 30. You must call Burn Control at 627-4949 the day you plan to burn. There is also a link for Burn Control on our City website at www.sccity.org. Click on the Public Safety drop down bar and select Fire Department and then Burn Window, then you will see the link for a Burn Permit. Permission to burn will depend on weather conditions and the clearing index. Fires must be attended until completely extinguished. Make sure you have a hose or other extinguishing equipment with you at the burn site. All burning must take place during daylight hours.

MAY 2016 MESSAGE from TODE HAFEN, SC CITY COUNCIL

As our weather warms, we are all excited to get outside and enjoy our beautiful surroundings. Let me pass along a few ideas about our neighbor to the north.

We are very fortunate to live close to one of the most beautiful State Parks in America. If you enjoy hiking, biking, rock climbing, camping, photography, horseback riding, digging in the sand dunes, or just absorbing some of the most beautiful scenery imaginable, Snow Canyon State Park is for you. You can pick up an updated map of the spectacular trails at either entrance kiosk.

Regardless of how many times you have paid a visit, here are a few things you may not know about Snow Canyon State Park.

Did You Know: Snow Canyon State Park hosts free hikes and programs throughout the year. Park entrance fees are waived for program participants and programs are free of charge. Explore a lava tube, see the park by moonlight, or try your hand at nature sketching. Did You Know: April is one of the best months for viewing wildflowers in Snow Canyon State Park. Visitors can currently see the bright pink blooms of the Mojave prickly pear cactus, and creamy white blossoms of the Utah yucca. Both creosote and indigo bushes will be blooming soon – lighting up the canyon with their respective yellow and purple blossoms.

Did You Know: Snow Canyon State Park is the only Utah State Park to offer a park specific pass? Designed with residents in mind the \$30 Desert Discovery Pass waives the entrance fee into the park (for up to eight people in the same private vehicle) for one year from month purchased. The pass has a detachable "pocket pass" that can be used for groups of up to eight walking or biking into the canyon. Start the New Year off right and buy your pass today; for more information please contact park staff at 435-628-2255.

Did you Know: Visitors come from all over the State and country to view the beauty of Snow Canyon State Park. They also come with hopes of seeing one of our southwest Utah specialties such as the desert tortoise, Gila monster, and chuckwalla. On your next visit to Snow Canyon be alert; one of these amazing creatures may just cross your path! For more information on park trails and picnic areas please contact park staff at 435-628-2255. Volunteer opportunities are also available for individuals or groups.

MAY 2016 CEMETERY SPRING CLEAN UP

The Spring cemetery clean up will begin Monday May 2nd. All flowers, decorations, shepherds hooks, and other ornaments should be removed from the cemetery before May 2nd. Remaining flowers and decorations will be removed by city personnel, with the exception of fresh burials. Flowers and decorations can be returned to the cemetery on Friday May 6th. WCWCD FREE WATER CHECKS

Free water system checks are available by the Washington County Water Conservancy District. The program runs between May 15—Sep 30th. The water check gives you a customized irrigation schedule, identifies your soil type, and suggests ways to efficiently water your landscape. SHORT TERM RENTALS: Information and Correction to April Newsletter Article

Short term rentals are becoming increasingly popular. Short term rentals are considered a rental that occurs between a property owner and a renter for 29 consecutive days or less.

There are only certain areas within the city currently zoned for the short term or nightly rentals. They include: Paradise Village at Zion, Lava Falls at Entrada and Sand Pointe. Last month's newsletter mistakenly listed Lava Cove at Entrada—we sincerely apologize for that error as Lava Cove at Entrada does not allow for short term rentals.

In the areas where they are allowed, short term rental properties must be managed by a property manager with a Santa Clara City business license and a Utah Sales Tax License to report transient room tax. Any home that is in an R-1-10 residentially zoned area, is NOT permitted to have a short-term type of rental at that property. As per Section 17.20.260(A), the Santa Clara City Code states a short term rental outside of the currently allowed zoned areas could result in penalties and fines.
