

**CITY OF SANTA CLARA
ORDINANCE 2016-16**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MASTER ROAD PLAN

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Santa Clara met in regular session on December 14, 2016 to consider Amending the Master Road Plan (an element of the City General Plan) to realign and add certain roads; and

WHEREAS, the City Subdivision Ordinance requires that intersections shall align, or not be offset by more than 250', and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments help inform property owners and developers of the need to properly align intersections when development occurs, and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission recommends approval of the proposed amendments to the Master Road Plan, and

WHEREAS, after careful consideration and review the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Santa Clara to adopt the recommendation to amend the Master Road Plan as proposed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Santa Clara as follows:

Section 1. Findings. The City Council finds and determines as follows;

1. Align Patricia Drive near the intersection with Tuscany Drive so that Patricia Drive aligns with Manzoni Drive and creates a standard 4-way intersection, rather than an offset intersection. When new development occurs along Patricia Drive, this intersection should be re-aligned to create the standard 4-way intersection.
2. Align Claude Drive with Malaga Drive to create a standard 4-way intersection rather than an offset intersection. When new development occurs, this intersection needs to be realigned with Claude to create a safer 4-way intersection.
3. Show a public street connecting Rachel Drive with Red Mountain Drive at approximately 2400 North.

Section 3. Adoption.

The City Council hereby approves and adopts the amendment to the Master Road Plan, this Ordinance shall become effective on December 14, 2016.
