NEW CITY OFFICE HOURS

Friday City Office and Justice Court hours have changed. The new Friday schedule for the Santa Clara City Justice Court and other city office departments is now 8:00 am—1:00 pm. Friday court hours have been 8-10 am: the new Friday schedule will provide longer Justice Court hours to help accommodate customers with court questions and provide other court services. All other city office departments now have the same 8am-1pm schedule.

On Thursday May 25th, the newly constructed Santa Clara Veterans Memorial Monument will be dedicated at the Cemetery. The ceremony will begin at 7:00 pm and everyone is invited. This monument will be dedicated to the many veterans who have lived in Santa Clara since the community was settled that have served in the United States military. All branches of the military will be recognized by a series of flags surrounding three large natural stone monuments. Stone pavers will recognize the veterans individually and large stone monuments will recognize all veterans for their service and sacrifice for their country.

A volunteer committee has worked for many years to design the monument, find a suitable location, raise the necessary funds for construction and finally construct a memorial we hope all veterans, their families and all of the citizens of Santa Clara, past and present, will appreciate and enjoy for many generations to come. Kudos to committee members Councilman Ken Sizemore, Parks Director Brad Hays, Wade Roberts, Terri Rosenberg, Charlie Clayton, and Sarah Mathis Schulz. Thanks also to Rosenberg Associates Civil Engineers, Paul Lillywhite Stone, Kenworthy Monuments, Border States Lighting, Noal Hansen Rock Quarry, Randy Frei Concrete and the City Public Services Crew for their hard work and talents constructing the monument.

Stone pavers are still available for purchase and engraving, for more information contact Town Hall. I hope everyone will take the opportunity to visit the monument and remember all of the veterans who have lived in Santa Clara since the community was founded. Their service provided the opportunity for each of us to enjoy the freedoms we take for granted every day. This Memorial Day let's celebrate their service and recognize them for their service.

In other news, Santa Clara Power was recently awarded a Certificate of Excellence in Reliability from the American Public Power Association. The City Power Department significantly outperforms the electric industry national average for reliability. Hats off to the City Power Department Staff for their good work keeping the power on. Also, the street slurry seal project is underway and residents are reminded to be careful around construction equipment and pay attention to road closures and detours.

The City is working with Washington County and the BLM to identify a designated shooting range site in the South Hills that could be improved for all types of shooting sports. Shooting is very popular with residents in the area, but there are serious safety concerns with the large amount of mountain bikers, ATV use, hiking and other recreational activities also using the area. The City hopes to identify a site and improve the road to the shooting range in the near future. When the designated range is opened, shooting will be closed in the other areas in the South Hills and enforced in accordance with City Ordinance.

May is also graduation time and summer is just around the corner. The City would like to congratulate the Class of 2017 and wish them all good luck and happiness in their future endeavors. These young people face a very challenging and exciting time ahead and I wish them the best. Until next month, stay safe Santa Clara. Mayor Rosenberg

SPRING BURN WINDOW

The 2017 Spring Burn Window is open through May 30. You must always call Burn Control at 627-4949 the day you plan to burn. There is also a link for Burn Control on the City website at www.sccity.org Click on the Public Safety drop down bar and select Fire Department and then Burn Window, you will then see the link for a Burn Permit. Permission to burn depends on weather conditions and the clearing index. Fires must be attended to until completely extinguished. Make sure you have a hose or other fire extinguishing equipment at the burn site. Burning must take place during daylight hours.

WCWCD FREE WATER CHECKS

Free water system checks will be available by the Washington County Water Conservancy District between May 15-Sep 30. The water check gives you a customized irrigation schedule, identifies your soil type, and suggests ways to efficiently water your landscape. 2017 Municipal Election Opportunity

This is the year for Municipal Elections. Santa Clara will have The Mayor and 2 City Council seats open in this election. Each seat is for a 4-year term. The November Election will be held on Tuesday, November 7, 2017. If a Primary Election is needed it will be Tuesday August 15, 2017. Candidate filing period is June 1-7, 2017.

Please consider serving your community by running for office for one of these positions. Qualifications to hold a Municipal Office are:

- 1. Be a US Citizen at the time of filing
- 2. Be a registered voter of the municipality
- 3. Be a resident of the municipality or a resident of the recently annexed area for a period of 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of the election.

(Utah Code 10-3-301; 20A-9-201; 20A-9-203)

STORM WATER PROTECTION REMINDER

Chlorinated water is a source of pollution to our storm water System. Swimming pools are a major source of chlorinated water discharged into our storm water system. Pools have high concentrations of chlorine, which is toxic to wildlife and fish.

Pool owners who drain their pools should De-chlorinate there pools before draining. When possible drain the De-chlorinated water to land where it will not drain to surface waters or directly into the storm drain system. These simple steps will help protect our water quality and have a positive impact on fish and wildlife.
